High value products

- BONSAI trees and fruit trees with bonsai value added
- Native / local varieties of chickens, ducks, pigs, rooster, goose, fish raised all in natural farming way, smaller pockets and scattered across land area;
- Selling price of chickens and pig is 100% higher than ordinary ones in the markets for example: pig is sold at 150,000/kg while normal pig is around 70,000
- Ducks and chickens price similar
- Pigs newly branded ("Matcha green-tea" pigs)
- Water turtle
- Greenhouse Organic vegetable
- Flowers





Farming systems

- Corn/maize, tomato, pumpkin, leafy green intercrop
- Corn and banana leaves for animals feed
- Local livestock varieties
- Ponds with different fish
- Agroforestry
- Sprinkler system water management
- Water turtle
- Greenhouse organic vegetable

Broader agroecology

- "Farm to fork" restaurant rather than focus on direct sales
- Agro-tourism

Integrated organic farm (Junozd)

- Produce about 2 tons of worm compost worth at least 4,000,000 VND (compost alone is 4,000/kg, compost+worm is 25,000/kg and 150,000/kg for worm only).
- Uses EM for vermicompost & pest management
- Crops in the farm include tea, strawberry, fruit trees and different kinds of vegetables

Broader agroecology

- In addition to be a farmer, she is a lecturer at TUAF
- Tea processing
- Importance of "honoring her parents"



TUAF (University)

- Founded in 1967, with 500 staff (50+% with PhD)
- Strong research for development orientation and many research collaborations
- Interesting AE-related research focused on field-farm level practices & food system analysis
- Integration of AE in existing curriculum at different faculties such a agronomy, forestry and livestock
